
Murray Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 8, which is located in the Southwest Planning Region.

POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

2021 population:

8,144 people

Murray Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2021, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Murray Co. welcomed net international inmigration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 1).





Murray Co.'s population decreased over the past decade, ranking as the 81st fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2020. It is now the 75th largest in the state. Murray Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Population change, 2010-2020 -6.7% decline






POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Murray Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2023 to 2033, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (5.6%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to decrease over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Murray Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.8%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Murray Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3.8%, Murray Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2021. After the pandemic recession Murray Co.'s unemployment rate decreased compared to 5.3% in 2020, and declined compared to the 4.5% rate posted in 2019, pre-pandemic. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Murray Co. declined over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.




Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates Minnesota Murray Co. 7,000 3,200,000 5,755 3,150,000 6,000 3,100,000 ocal Labor Force 5,000 3,050,000 3,000,000 4,000 2,950,000 3,000 2,900,000 2,850,000 2,000 2,800,000 1,000 2,750,000 0 2,700,000

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of 65 workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Murray Co. averaged an annual loss of -17.8 fewer workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of -14.1 fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. Job vacancies in Southwest reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Murray Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Murray Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 84.8% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Murray Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Murray Co. had the 36th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past year with costs up in many areas. Murray Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.43 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$15.1

for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

OCCUPATIONS

At \$19.1 in 2021, wages were lower in Region 8 than the state. Overall, Region 8 had the 4th lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$39.02) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$12.3) (see Table 11).



Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Murray Co. had the 73rd largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Murray Co. was the 64th fastest growing in the past year and the 48th fastest growing since 2019, prior to the pandemic. From 2019 to 2021, employment in Murray Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.

Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2006-2021


